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BACKGROUND

Undertaking a market assessment, business process review and requirements development to assist in the procurement of a new multi-modal biometric system. Ben was the project manager responsible for managing the day to day engagement activities. The project assisted CrimTrac make an informed decision on their preferred service delivery option and also to develop the business case to seek funding for the implementation of their future state biometric system. Along with project management responsibility, Ben was also a key contributor to the market assessment report as well as the review of current and future state business process and requirements development. The successful delivery of this project has assisted in equipping Australia's law enforcement agencies with the necessary capabilities to identify individuals and prevent crime.

Other Federal Government Experience

Responsible for liaising and briefing on intelligence agency issues, and coordinating relevant legislative reforms. Ben played an instrumental role in the development of complex amendments to intelligence agency legislation and also led the development and implementation of the Independent Reviewer of Adverse Security Assessments. He also provided support responding to High Court cases challenging adverse security assessments.

Coordinated Departmental input into Cabinet documents, and prepared briefings for senior management and Ministers for Cabinet meetings. He coordinated briefing sessions with the Secretary and senior managers from various areas of the Department, and managed the briefing process for Community Cabinet meetings.

Responsible for policy development on disability access to premises standards, non-building premises issues, access to information and review of standards. He co-ordinated the signing, tabling and launch of the Disability (Access to Premises Buildings) Standards 2010, and represented the Commonwealth at various meetings with stakeholders, including the Commonwealth Senior Property Officers Forum, Standards Australia meetings and Building Code Committee Officers Group.
